# Ordinance 13 The Court

### 1. Constitution of the Court

The following shall be members of the Court:

### a. Ex-officio members:

- i. The Chancellor
- ii. The Pro-Chancellor
- iii. The Vice-Chancellor;
- iv. The Deputy Vice-Chancellor(s) and Pro Vice-Chancellor(s);
- v. Deans of College
- vi. Members of the Council
- vii. President of the Students' Union
- viii. President of Undeb Myfyrwyr Cymraeg Bangor

#### b. <u>Representatives of the Community</u>

- i. Her Majesty's Lord-Lieutenants for Gwynedd and Clwyd;
- ii. The Members of the House of Commons representing the UK Government constituencies of Ynys Mon, Arfon, Dwyfor Meirionnydd, Aberconwy, Clwyd West, Clwyd South, Delyn, Vale of Clwyd and Wrexham;
- The Members of the Senedd representing the constituencies of Aberconwy, Alyn & Deeside, Arfon, Clwyd South, Clwyd West, Delyn, Dwyfor Meirionnydd, Montgomeryshire, Vale of Clwyd, Wrexham and Ynys Mon;
- iv. The Members of the Senedd representing the electoral regions of North Wales;
- v. The Chairs of Anglesey, Gwynedd, Conwy, Denbighshire, Flintshire, Powys and Wrexham councils;

  - v. The Royal Welsh Agricultural Society;
  - vi. The Country Landowners' Association
- 2. The Court is a public meeting, but only members may vote on any matter.
- 3. Terms of Membership of the Court
  - a. Representative members shall vacate office on ceasing to be members of the body appointing them, except in cases where they were not such member when the appointment was made.
  - b. Ex-officio members shall be members of the Court for the duration of their relevant periods of office.

- c. A member of the Court may resign at any time by writing to the Secretary to the Court.
- d. The person or body which appointed any member of Court, whose place has become vacant shall take steps to fill the vacancy as soon as conveniently possible.
- 4. Powers of the Court
  - a. To receive, comment and ask questions on reports on the workings of the University;
  - b. To receive, comment and ask questions on the Annual Audited Financial Statements;
  - c. To discuss any matters relating to the University and to make recommendations to the Council as it sees fit;
  - d. To act as a forum to discuss the University's role in the community.
- 5. Meetings of the Court
  - a. The Court shall meet at least annually to receive information on the working of the University.
  - b. The Annual Meeting of the Court shall include:
    - 1. Welcome by the Chancellor;
    - 2. A report on the work of the University by the Vice-Chancellor;
    - 3. The annual Accounts; and
    - 4. Other presentations on University activity.
  - c. The programme for the Court meeting shall be distributed in both Welsh and English
  - d. All members shall have the right, when addressing the Court, to speak in either Welsh or English.
  - e. A member of the Court can propose a resolution for discussion at a Court meeting. The Secretary to the Court should be informed at least three days before the meeting of the Court, of the intention to propose such a resolution.
  - f. In addition to the membership outlined in this Ordinance the University reserves the right to send out additional invitations, as appropriate, to any meeting of the Court.
