

Tuition Fees for Home/EU (and Island) 2019/20

- 1) **Fee Status:** Fee status is assessed in accordance with the Education (Fees and Awards) Regulations 1983 (as amended). Additional guidance on Home/Overseas fee status is available from the UK Council for International Affairs ([UKCISA](#)).
- 2) These are fees for students starting a programme during the 2019/20 academic year. Fees for continuing students can be found by referring to the schedule that corresponds to the year of the commencement of studies, [here](#).
- 3) Please note that additional bench fee/laboratory charges may be raised on certain postgraduate programmes. Students will be informed of this when offered a place at the University.
- 4) **Part-time Fees:** Unless listed separately, part-time fees for programmes are charged as an approximate proportion of the full-time fee.
- 5) **Tuition Fees for Staff:** All Bangor University employees (with the exception of those who are currently or will be registered as a full-time student) are eligible to be considered for a fee waiver on university programmes. (See Terms & Conditions at the end of this document)
- 6) **Charging and Refund Policy:** You should ensure that you are aware of the financial implications of suspending or terminating your studies prior to accepting your offer of a place at the University. Students in receipt of US Loans please see [here](#).
- 7) **Important: Withdrawals & Suspensions** Thinking of Leaving; please see [here](#). Tuition fees will remain due up until the date that the University receives a correctly completed university withdrawal/suspension form; retrospective [suspensions](#) will not normally be authorised.

Tuition Fees for Staff (Terms & Conditions)

- The member of staff should have a formal contract of employment (liable for class 1A NI contributions unless exempted from NI due to age) with the University, valid from the date of registration until the end of the 'current' fee charging period (e.g. academic year).
- Where a member of staff is employed as a Research Assistant and the registration on a research degree is a condition of the employment contract, tuition fees are eligible for consideration for a fee waiver.
- The contracted working hours should be greater than 12 hours per week.
- Where the contract of employment terminates part way through a subsequent fee charging period (e.g. next academic year), fees will be charged on a pro-rata basis from the end of the contract.
- Fee waivers are not available where a member of staff is eligible to claim the equivalent of the tuition fee through a Local Education Authority grant
- Where fees have been charged on a pro-rata basis from the end of a contract, the fees will be recalculated or reimbursed as appropriate if a contract is extended or a new contract is issued.
- Any additional charges (e.g. bench fees, study visits, dissertation submission, examination, etc) will still be payable.
- Where a student ceases to qualify for a fee waiver part way through a programme, and more than 50% of the tuition fee has been covered by the waiver, then the examination fee will be due.
- In the case of all students, the granting of a fee waiver will be subject to the agreement of the academic school concerned.
